# ABOUT NKWA

Nkwa Foundation is a Ghanaian non-profit organization that focuses on sustainable community development, health promotion, and rural education support in Cape Coast, Ghana. Founded in 2013, Nkwa works primarily in rural communities in the Komenda, Edina, Eguafo, and Abirem District of Cape Coast to advocate for and empower communities to achieve development by providing a variety of opportunities to help sustain livelihoods and the wellbeing of community members. The foundation currently focuses all of its community-based projects in the neighboring villages in the Central Region, including Breman, Eguafo, and Ponkrom. By concentrating all our work in one particular region, we are able to have a greater, more meaningful impact in the communities we serve. In addition, Nkwa Foundation provides a wide range of accounting & management consulting services to other non- profit organizations, private business, small and mid-size businesses in the Central Region.

Nkwa also recognizes the importance of global education and collaboration; therefore the foundation provides academic internships to inspire and educate international students to create change on a global scale. We partner with university institutions here in Ghana and internationally to provide opportunities for students seeking practical experience to supplement their studies at their respective institutions.

2014 being our first official operating year, we have been able to achieve many milestones, including obtaining 501(c)3 federal tax exemption status from the United States, hosting international interns and the successful first year operation of all our projects in Breman, Eguafo, and Ponkrom.


## Monitor and evaluate community needs and project progress.

## **2014 Impact in numbers:**

Nkwa's Health Outreach project objective is to educate community members about prevalent health issues common in Ghana and to empower them to take ownership of their health at home. Outreach talks often attract 80 to 100 men, women, and elders and provide an important opportunity for Nkwa to find out about health problems within the community and refer those needing treatment to appropriate medical care. Topics covered include: family planning methods, HIV/AIDS education, proper nutrition, diabetes diagnosis and symptoms, hypertension, asthma diagnosis and symptoms, malaria diagnosis and symptoms, drug abuse, nutrition, and other communicable diseases (ex. Ebola).

Community health nurses and health professionals through the University of Cape Coast, University of Cape Coast Hospital, and Agona Health Centre presented these topics with assistance from interns. After outreaches, mobile clinics were run with the nurses to obtain basic health indicators (ex. weight, blood pressure, basic testing). Any outstanding cases were counseled and referred to Agona Health Centre for further treatment.

Moving forward, we are hoping to develop an extensive health database for each of the villages to have a better understanding of the demographic, health, and economic statuses of the families. This information will be obtained through the completion of surveys and provide us with valuable insight into our progress within the village and future needs that need to be addressed.





**LOCATION: Breman** 

PARTNERS: Organic Farmers
Market Association

The organic farm project seeks to unite local knowledge and modern agricultural techniques to offer economic sustainability for women in the community of Breman. With increasing demand for organic produce, both in Ghana and globally, skills-based learning of organic agricultural techniques will enable communities to create environmentally and economically sustainable livelihoods. Nkwa Foundation provides this skills-based learning through the facilitation of workshops on organic farming.

On the 2 acre farm, we initially decided to grow green pepper, carrots, beans, cassava, and maize. However due to the stark climate difference between rainy and dry season affecting crop growth, we have chosen to continue with drought-resilient crops on the farm to increase our output, specifically maize and cassava. The first seeds were planted with the help of our summer interns. Currently, four widowed women from Breman are employed on the farm and are supervised by Kwame Afful, an experienced farmer from the same village. No chemicals are used to maintain the farm. The cassava and maize will be harvested during the spring of 2015.

PARTNERS: Ministry of Education (Komenda Edna Eguafo Abriem District), Ponkrom Primary School

that, the children must either walk to the next village or quit school and start working (usually the latter). Upon the completion of the structure, the Ministry of Education will provide teachers and other necessary teaching materials to facilitate the expansion of the school.

During 2014, we were able to donate exercise books, chalk, and the necessary building construction materials to the headmaster to improve the infrastructure and resources available at the school. The project was started with a 4000

Currently, Nkwa Foundation is constructing classrooms for the pupils of Ponkrom by providing a new school building with the necessary items (books, uniforms, chalk boards and furniture). As of now, the Government of Ghana pro-

vides primary education up to grade six, however, due to a lack of available

space, Ponkrom has only been able to provide up to grade four. This means

building construction materials to the headmaster to improve the infrastructure and resources available at the school. The project was started with a 4000 Ghana Cedis donation from Kwantlen Polytechnic University student interns, from the School of Social Justice led by Professor Charles Quiste-Adade. Because we want the village of Ponkrom to take ownership and pride in the project, Nkwa Foundation only provides the materials and not the labour associated with constructing the extra classrooms. The headmaster of the school serves as the project coordinator.

The construction of the school was significantly hampered by Ghana's rising inflation and depreciating currency. The original amount of funds we had budgeted for the school proved to be insufficient and thus we were only able to provide enough materials to finish one classroom. Therefore, the school teachers have been forced to build a makeshift roof with roofing sheets and wooden stilts (as seen in the picture above) to utilize the newly built classroom space.

LOCATION: Ponkrom, Breman, Eguafo



Nkwa seeks to provide safe and portable drinking water for rural communities in the Komenda Edina Eguafo Abriem District in the Central Region. The inaugural site for this project was the village of Breman, where we were able to construct one well that provides water for the community as well as the organic farm. Currently, the community of Breman accesses water from a contaminated water source, as they primarily walk to a nearby slow-flowing stream (as seen on the left).

We hope to further develop this project in the years to come. Considering the lessons learned from our pilot project in Breman, we aim to build boreholes rather than wells in the future due to their greater stability and lower maintenance.
